

William Haag, Lt Col USAF (Ret) hails from Latham, New York. Commissioned from the United States Air Force Academy in 1991 with a B.Sc. in Russian Area Studies, he flew the KC-135A tanker and E-3 AWACS (US and NATO) as a master instructor navigator for 3,300 hours including 980 combat support hours supporting UN resolutions in the Middle East and Balkans. As USAFE's (United States Air Force in Europe) lead planner, he directly prepared humanitarian relief support to Darfur, Sudan, Lebanon, and Morocco and crafted air policing plans/operational rehearsals for the 2006 Winter Olympics, NATO Riga Summit, and the 2007 AU/EU Lisbon Summit (CAOC 10, Monsanto, Portugal).
