Kaetana Leontjeva is currently pursuing a Ph.D. at the Department of Political Economy at King's College London, under the supervision of Dr John Meadowcroft and Professor Philip Booth. Her research focuses on fiscal illusion among UK taxpayers. Her paper with the main dissertation findings was shortlisted for the Ostrom Prize for best graduate student and presentation at the Public Choice Society Meeting (2019). Kaetana graduated *cum laude* from Tufts University (2007) with a B.A. in Economics and International Relations (double major). She also holds an M.A. in Religious Studies from Vilnius University, Lithuania (2011).

From 2007 to 2015, she was a policy analyst in public finance at the Lithuanian Free Market Institute, a think tank. In this capacity, she analyzed draft laws, conceptualized reforms, and was member of governmental working groups to reform the tax system. During this period, she prominently wrote in and commented to the Lithuanian media.

As part of her work at the think tank, she developed a personalized fiscal calculator <u>http://mokumokescius.lt/en/</u> – a simple and engaging tool to show taxpayers how much tax they pay, including indirect tax, and their personal costs of public services. The tax calculator has been used by a tenth of Lithuania's workforce, and successfully exported to Poland, Ukraine, and Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Kaetana was a lecturer of Christian social teaching at Kolping College in Kaunas, Lithuania. She has also widely presented at various academic and popular conferences and events.
