"LIBERALISM OR COMMUNITARIANISM?"

<u>Introduction</u>

During the last decade, Political Theory has increasingly been dominated by the powerful intellectual challenge against liberalism in various ways, by a group of authors usually named "communitarians". Departing from a critique to the philosophical and metaphysical foundations of liberal individualism, the communitarian critique ended up by extending itself to all crucial aspects of liberalism, especially the relationship between the individual and the communities, as well as the role of the State in contemporary societies, the concept of social justice, etc.

During this week we will try to make a critical introduction to this crucial debate in contemporary political thought – and with two leading figures in this controversy: Professors John Gray, from Oxfod and Steven Lukes from the European University Institute of Florence.
