Digital Afterlives AI, memory, mourning

Against the background of a cultural crisis of mourning, a new industry is leveraging generative Artificial Intelligence (AI) to address grief. So-called "ghostbots" are trained on data from a specific deceased person, like text messages, emails, and videos, to create an interactive digital companion that simulates them. Proponents claim that such AI might better address grief than traditional practices or even allow for the continued existence of the dead. Our project, "Digital Afterlives: AI, Memory, and Mourning," is an international and interdisciplinary collaboration between the Digital Ethics Laboratory of Universidade Católica Portuguesa, the IBM Tech Ethics Lab of Notre Dame University, and the Institute for Advanced Studies in Culture at the University of Virginia. It examines the reasons behind the rise of ghostbots and the ethical and religious concerns raised by the technology. At a deeper level, the project explores the place of grief and mourning in a flourishing life and what might be the proper role of technology in contemporary mourning.
